




Funding calls at the DSI

DSI Infrastructures & Labs (until 2026)

- Goal: Creation of collaborative research environments
- Funding of 1-2 years and max. CHF 200'000.
- Currently: 17 projects, first ones will close 2024 or become permanent infrastructures

Excellence Program Scholarships (until 2025)

- Scholarship for graduates of the Excellence Program
- Funding for up to 4 years (last time 2024/2025)
- Prerequisite: doctoral student at UZH
- Deadline: **January 15, 2025**



DSI Strategy Lab: annual research focus

1. DSI Strategy Lab (2021)

«A Legal Framework for Artificial Intelligence»

- Presentation of the results in the Federal Parliament
- The results have led to several parliamentary activities at cantonal and national level

2. DSI Strategy Lab (2022)

«Artificial intelligence in medicine - where do we want to go?

- Digital Twins identified as an important development in the future
- Objectives and recommendations for the responsible use of Digital
 Twins in medicine developed and summarized in a position paper

3. DSI Strategy Lab (2023)

«Al in education, research and innovation»

- The objectives and recommendations were summarized in a position paper, which has been published in August.
- The position paper was discussed internally at UZH in various News articles.






Online studies: Studium Digitale

- Computer science bootcamp for students without programming skills
- 30 credits (ECTS)
- Started this fall semester 2024 with 38 motivated students currently engaged in the core modules of the program



Journalists Workshops




After successful events in 2023, the third and fourth editions of the media workshop took place this year – in May and September 2024.
